
2020 Aquatics Timeline

January 1 - 31: Swim Lesson registrations improved 500% over January 2019



January

- Sand Filter at Battery Creek is causing sand to enter the pool through it's jets, broken lateral suspected
- Swim lesson registration numbers sharply increase
- New, Walk-In Individual Swim Lessons introduced, \$10 for 30-minute lesson, no appointment necessary
- Water level at Beaufort Pool drops inches daily, leak strongly suspected

February

- More lifeguards need to be hired to meet individual swim lesson demand at Bluffton Pool
- Sand and broken laterals in filter at Battery Creek Pool are replaced
- Pool Heater at Battery Creek not working

March

- Bluffton Pool gets new pump and filter system
- Pool Heater at Battery Creek Pool fixed
- Pools areas are thoroughly disinfected in response to Covid-19
- Pools closed Aquatics Staff re-organized into three teams: Maintenance, Senior Services, and Animal Services
- Bluffton, Battery Creek, and Bluffton pool decks are powerwashed and deck drains strongly flushed out

- All indoor pools get large, box fans to increase air flow from deck's sliding glass doors
- No new seasonal staff hired

June

- Pools re-open with new hours and rules to prevent Covid transmission, staff uses new Covid Waiver to limit liability
- Beaufort Pool's, on-deck sliding glass doors get tracks fixed to allow maximum outdoor air ventilation
- Lind Brown Outdoor Pool uncovered, cleaned and opened for the season
- Majority of pool patrons patient and understanding with new rules, a few become belligerent about the change
- Parents of children in swim lessons unhappy at temporary "Teaching From Deck" social-distancing policy

<u>June</u>

- · All Pools closed again
- Aquatics Staff re-assigned to department's Grounds Maintenance Crew to cover employee absences

<u>July</u>

- All aquatics staff has multiple certifications updated
- All indoor pools open 7am-9am to accommodate school swim team practices only
- Lind Brown Outdoor Pool is re-covered for season

September / October

All indoor pools open 7am-9am to accommodate school swim team practices only

November

- Battery Creek and Bluffton re-opened with limited hours and staff / Beaufort Pool resurfacing continues
- Beaufort Pool re-opened with new resurfacing with limited hours and staff

Re: Explanation of Services for RFP for Senior Day Program

This message will explain our services for our RFP with the Senior Day Programs.

Due to Covid-19, Love House Learning ACADEMY have not held face-to-face services with the Senior Citizens that we serve since March 13, 2020 due to the danger Covid-19 poses to our aging population.

In exchange for these services, LHLA redeveloped our program to continue meeting senior's needs with door-to-door meals delivered five-days a week with seven fresh frozen meals that can be heated within five minutes. These daily deliveries allowed us to physically see the seniors we serve to have in person wellness checks. This also allowed us to provide seniors with a nutritious meal balanced by a Dietitian to assist them with maintaining their health during this pandemic. Meals are dropped off at the door where the small talk begins and ends. For many of these seniors, we are their only daily visitation.

We have also been able to provide seniors with masks and sanitizer for their protection on a rotating basis. We also deliver to each family a fresh box of vegetables with fresh fruit to help provide garden fresh nutrients to those seniors with limited transportation. This support helps to reduce their exposure and without it many would have been at risk of their health to meet their basic needs.

Earlier this year, due to Covid-19, the vehicles assigned to LHLA were returned to PALS to "limit the risk" of exposure to the virus for Beaufort County employees who drive vehicles for services alone. Our feeding program for the senior citizens of Beaufort County began Thursday, March 19, 2020. It was at this time, PALS offered to support LHLA senior feeding program by contributing PALS spare staffing along with vehicles to help LHLA deliver food to support our new Covid-19 feeding program.

On June 1, 2020 Beaufort County re-opened and many of PALS supporting staff returned to their normal duties; however, one continued for a few additional weeks to train their replacement. This was a great support to us and we truly appreciate all the help PALS has given us. We now have four staff members delivering food three times a week as we continue our feeding program. Also to date, we have served an estimated of 13,440 fresh frozen meals, 1575 fresh fruit and vegetables boxes, 400 face mask, and sanitizer to an average of 80 senior citizens since March 2020.

As of today, we have received enough funding to support senior feeding throughout the end of 2020.
